



## CLINICAL TRIALS BY NUMBERS




took part in clinical studies at our partner trusts last year.

**45,000 patients**





South London and Maudsley is the top mental trust in England for conducting clinical trials.

Guy's and St Thomas' recruits more patients into clinical trials than any other trust in the country and King's College Hospital recruited the fourth highest amount in the last year.

1 in 50 school age children in the UK have peanut allergy.
